The Murtala Muhammed Foundation (MMF) is a not-for-profit organization dedicated to the development of Africa's people. Millions of lives have been positively impacted by the Foundation's programs, notably those that are marginalized, disadvantaged, and vulnerable.

It is through the MMF's unwavering commitment to excellence in the areas of advocacy, education, women's empowerment, and humanitarian assistance that the Foundation has provided leadership in Africa's fight against poverty and hunger and sustainable development.

In the last 20 years since its inception, MMF has made great strides in empowering young Africans to take greater control of their own lives and achieve their full potential by facilitating access to educational and training support, skills, and creativity as well as advocating for greater gender equality and better governance in the continent's developing countries.

MMF is one of the key organizations spearheading the reconstruction of Nigeria's northeast and northwest region, which has been devastated by insurgency. Over 10 million people across Nigeria's 36 states including the Federal Capital Territory (FCT) have benefited from the Foundation's work

Summary

We have delivered critical intervention to over 10 million direct and indirect beneficiaries since beginning operation in 2001.

The last 20 years has been transformational for the Murtala Muhammed Foundation. We have metamorphosed on our theory of change and intervention delivery mechanisms. This summarized report captures our impact succinctly.

In 2020, the Covid-19 pandemic further re-enforced the importance of the work we do as an organization. At a time when most development and humanitarian organizations were closing up, we innovated and began operating fully virtually. This ensured that we continued to serve the people that depended on our critical interventions.

Between 2020 and now, we have helped over 100 women in business scale and pivot through our partnership with the Cherie Blair Foundation in UK. We provided education scholarship to over 200 students in Primary, Secondary and Universities.

In February this year (2022), we hosted an annual lecture in memory of Late General Murtala Muhammed with the theme: Beyond Boko Haram: Addressing Insurgency, Banditry and Kidnapping Across Nigeria. In attendance was Chief Olusegun Obasanjo, Governor Kayode Fayemi of Ekiti State, Governor Rotimi Akeredolu of Ondo State, Former Governor Ibikunle Amosu of Ogun State, Military Heads, heads of Diplomatic Corps and other dignitaries.

With our Humanitarian service delivery, we have provided IDPs and other affected population with with basic services such as education, food, water sanitation and hygiene (WASH) services and food supplies.





Murtala Muhammed Foundation Donates Medical & Sanitization Supplies, Others to NCDC, Lagos



In 2020, at the peak of the Covid-19 pandemic, The Murtala Muhammed Foundation (MMF) supported the Nigeria Centre for Disease Control (NCDC) in Lagos, with medical masks, gloves and essential supplies to help combat the fight against the COVID-19 epidemic in Nigeria.

We collaborated with NCDC Lagos to ensure that "the country's health workers are equipped to discharge their duties without grave risk to themselves. These brave Nigerians dedicated their time to helping Nigerians and we wanted to be able to equip them properly to discharge their duties.

We donated the following items to the Central Public Health Laboratory Yaba, Lagos:

- 5,500 units of Disposable Medical Face Masks;
- 2,500 units of N95 Respirator and Surgical Face Masks (3M N95 8810/8822);
- 20,000 units of Latex Examination Gloves;
- 50,000 ml of Hand Sanitizer;
- 50,000 ml of Antiseptic Liquid Soap;
- 100,000 ml of Germicide Liquid;
- 50,000 ml of Antiseptic Lotion;
- 8 Infrared Red Non-contact Digital Thermometers and
- 47,500ml Sodium Hydro Chloride Liquid.

EDUCATION

As an organization, we have provided direct assistance to over 300,000 in and out of school children across Nigeria, most especially in the North East where there is prevailing conflict.

Our goal is to improve the quality of education and democratize learning in Nigeria.

Provided over 500 education scholarships to students

Through our education intervention, we are providing scholarships to children with autism and other forms of disabilities; orphans and vulnerable children in Nigeria; indigent children; girl-child in STEM

Provided 57,000 students with technology education

COMPUTER FOR SCHOOL

Initiated in 2007, MMF provides schools across 17 states in Nigeria with well-equipped computer labs while building children's capacity in technology

56 computer laboratories setup so far across Nigeria.

ZUBA BOX

We were awarded the production rights for the Zuba box inWest Africa by Computer Aid International. The Zuba box is a panacea for the dearth of power supply especially in rural areas and IDP camps.

The device is currently used by 3000 households and schools across Nigeria



HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE

We are providing support to communities affected by disaster, strengthening institutional capacity to manage disaster and emergencies. We provides relief materials in the form of food items and non-food items to victims.

Under this thematic area, we are providing psychosocial support to victims of conflict; sensitizing communities and IDPs; strengthening resilience of affected families and communities; providing opportunities for self-reliance.

Over 1 Million Beneficiaries

FOOD

We have distributed food and non-food items to over 1 million beneficiaries across Nigeria.

SAFE SCHOOL

Sensitized communities comprising approximately 95,000 residents, and enhanced collaboration in the relocation of children from unsafe environments to safer schools.

INFRASTRUCTURES

Provided assistance and rehabilitation to victims of the Ikeja cantonment bomb blast

Ensured reconstruction of 7 schools, restoring over 50,000 students to academic activities in schools

Provided disaster relief to EAS airline crash victims. MMF drilled a motorized borehole to provide water for the people.

Restored 7 classrooms for 50,000 students

ADVOCACY

MMF presented a draft Disaster Management bill to the National Assembly in 2007 and is at the forefront of the advocacy for the release of the abducted Chibok school girls.

Started in 2013 – it is aimed at economic development, empowerment and regional integration of African women in business. So far, we have:

Collaborated with Namibian Ministry of Gender Equality and Child Welfare in women-exchange program for improvement of African trade and investments

Trained over 400 women on entrepreneurship

600 women mentored through WIDEAA

CAPACITY BUILDING

We have offered trainings on technical skills, life building skills, soft skills, business management, financial literacy, socio-cultural norms to business women.










